But We Can't Respond From Closed Firehouses!

According to the City of New York, the FDNY has just completed four consecutive years that were the busiest in its 140-year history, including 473,335 Emergency Responses in 2008.

What will happen to our communities in all 5-boroughs after Mayor Bloomberg closes another 16 fire companies on top of the 7 he already shut? One was just closed in January; 4 more will close in July; and 12 more will cease operations following Election Day.
