Our mission is to reduce line-of-duty deaths and occupational-related deaths in the FDNY.

This health and safety grant provided by the UFA will help continue our mission of caring for NYC Firefighters. Our members are exposed to untold carcinogens in the daily course of our work. This program is designed to identify any ailments early enough for early treatment and a successful outcome. Members will be educated on how to reduce their risks while firefighting and be provided with early screening to detect and array of chronic health conditions. This partnership will encourage our members to get checked out and continue to be monitored for different types of cancers and heart diseases with no out-of-pocket expenses.

All testing is done in the NYFF Heart and Lung Institute office with the latest advanced technology in ultrasound and stress testing, along with a top board-certified cardiologist who will read each and every report that is performed. **Results will not be shared with the department and this will not affect your duty status.** Please remember to bring your insurance card and your work ID.
