America's 911 Foundation

Eligibility:

- Children of active members of both Fire and EMS are eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- Active members of both Fire and EMS are also eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- Children of retired or disabled members are not eligible.

Awards:

- Fifteen \$2,000 scholarships are awarded annually.
- The scholarship is renewable for up to four years.
- The scholarship is paid directly to the school.

Application:

- Applications are available online typically beginning mid-end November.

Dates:

- Applications are typically due in beginning of March.

A-Team Scholarship

Eligibility:

- Any child of an active or retired member of the UFA or UFOA is eligible to apply for this award.

BC Matthew Ryan Memorial Scholarships

BC Matthew Ryan Memorial Scholarships are named to honor the fallen Chief who made the supreme sacrifice on September 11, 2001.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be the daughter or son of an active, retired or deceased (line of duty or non-line of duty) member of the Fire Department.
- The Firefighter (not the student) must be an active, retired or deceased member who played hockey on a FDNY, Firehouse, Town, Local, or League hockey team.

Awards:

- Two \$1,000 scholarships are awarded annually and can be used for college/university, high school, trade school or private school.

Garden of Dreams Inspire Scholarship Program

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be high school seniors, ages 17 – 21, at the time of application submission and plan to enroll in full-time undergraduate study at an accredited two year or four year college, university or vocational-technical school for the entire academic year.
- Applicants must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or its equivalent), or provide official documentation supporting learning needs.

Awards:

- Awards ranging from \$10,000 up to \$25,000 will be granted each year.
- For students attending a two-year college or vocational-technical school, awards are renewable up to one year or until an associate degree or certificate is earned, whichever occurs first, on the basis of satisfactory academic performance (maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent).
- For students attending a four-year college or university, awards are renewable up to three years or until a bachelor's degree is earned, whichever occurs first, on the basis of satisfactory academic performance (maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent).

Application:

- Applicants must be recommended by and have received the application link from one of Garden of Dreams Foundation's partner organizations.
- Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, participation in Garden of Dreams events, school and community activities, demonstrated leadership, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, and an outside appraisal.
- Applicants will be required to submit a 500 word (or less) essay on how the Garden of Dreams Foundation has made an impact in their lives. Applicants must also submit a current, complete transcript of grades. A letter of recommendation from a Garden of Dreams Foundation partner organization on organization letterhead is also required.

Eligibility:

- Children of an active uniformed union members of the NYS Professional Firefighters Association are eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- This award is open to high school seniors and recent high school graduates who will not have completed more than one year of college.
- Applicants must have taken the SAT or ACT.

Awards:

- Eight scholarships for \$3,000 are awarded.
- The check is given to the student for educational expenses.

NYS Honorary Fire Chiefs and NYSPFF Ted Green Memorial College Scholarships

Eligibility:

- The scholarship competition is open to high school seniors/recent high school graduates who will not have completed more than one year of college by September of that academic year.
- Applicant must be a child of an active uniformed union member of the NYS Professional Firefighters Association.
- Members of the Executive Board or employees of the NYS Professional Firefighters Association or their children are not eligible.

Awards:

- An award of \$3,000 is given to each student selected.

Application:

- Applicants will be required to take the SAT or ACT test no later than January of that academic year.
- A Scholarship Essay of approximately 400-500 words indicating why you should be the recipient of the award is required with application.

Saint John's University Service Awards

Eligibility:

- An eligible student must be a dependent child of a fire department member (full-time active service, retired, or killed in the line of duty) and a current high school senior planning to enroll at St. John's in the upcoming fall term.
- Eligibility is dependent upon parent occupation as indicated on the Undergraduate Admission application for the upcoming fall term.

Awards:

- St. John's University will award \$2,000 per year for up to four years of continuous, full-time undergraduate enrollment to the children of firefighters within the United States.

Silver Shield Scholarship

Eligibility:

- Children of active Firefighters, Fire Officers, EMT, Paramedics, EMS Officers, Wipers, Engineers, Pilots or Fire Marshals are eligible to apply for this award.
- Children of retirees, deceased members, and civilians, as well as grandchildren and step-children, are not eligible.
- Applying student must have graduated from an accredited high school in the current year and be accepted at an accredited four (4) year college for summer or fall.

Awards:

- One \$5,000 scholarship is awarded annually to a winner chosen by lottery.
- The scholarship is renewable for up to four years.
- The scholarship is paid directly to the school.

Application:

- To be considered, student should write on a piece of paper and sign the page. The paper should be sealed in a plain white envelope with no address or markings.
- It should be enclosed in another envelope addressed to: Assistant Commissioner Evelyn Tesoriero, Family Assistance Unit, Silver Shield Scholarship, 9 MetroTech Center 8th Floor, Brooklyn, NY 11201.
- Write the parent's reference number across the seal of the outer envelope.
- Only one submission per child.

Terry Farrell Firefighter Fund

Eligibility:

- Scholarship is open to a child or children of an active, retired, disabled or deceased firefighter who is/or has served in the FDNY or a volunteer department.
- Applicants must reside in Nassau or Suffolk County.
- Student must attend a parochial or vocational school accredited by the State of New York. Eligible schools shall include any Elementary, Middle or High School; any College or University or Vocational Training Institute which is accredited.

Awards:

- Multiple scholarships between \$250 and \$1,000 will be awarded on a lottery basis.
- Students must re-apply each year.
- The check will be made out to the children chosen and must be used for educational purposes.

Eligibility:

- To be eligible for consideration, a child must be a dependent of a current or former member of Division 15 and currently attending a college that imposes a charge for tuition or entering a college in September that imposes a charge for tuition.

UFA Scholarship Fund

Eligibility:

- This scholarship is for dependent children of active, retired or deceased Firefighters, Fire Marshals, Marine Wipers, Marine Engineers & Pilots who are full-time students up to and including age 23 for undergraduate education. Applicants must currently be enrolled in college, trade or vocational school.
- Active members and their spouses are also eligible for this scholarship.
- Dependent children, spouses of LOD deceased UFA members, and dependent children of non-LOD deceased UFA members are eligible to receive scholarships for undergraduate education
- High School and Graduate students are not eligible for awards.

Awards:

- Students may receive a maximum of FOUR (4) UFA Scholarship Fund Awards.
- The annual number and amount of scholarships are dependent upon the amount of available funds. If applications exceed the number available, awards will be selected by lottery.
- Award checks will be mailed to the address you provide on the application, not necessarily the member's address.

Application:

- Proof of Enrollment for the upcoming academic semester for full-time students (12 credits minimum) in the form of an official letter from the school confirming enrollment AND credit load (not an acceptance letter) OR official schedule showing number of credits must be submitted with application.

- Awards may be renewed up to 4 years, applicants must reapply each year.

VFW Post 12033 Scholarship Program

Eligibility:

- Candidates must be the child or grandchild, either biological or adopted, sponsored by an active or retired member of the FDNY.
- The candidate's parent or grandparent must have served on active duty (DD-214) or be currently serving or previously served in a National Guard or Reserve Unit. Proof of military service must accompany the application.
- Applicant must be a graduating high school senior with intentions of attending a college or an accredited trade school.

Awards:

- One-time scholarships in the amount of \$500.00 to one male and one female will be awarded.
- Scholarship winner will be determined by drawing names from a hat.
